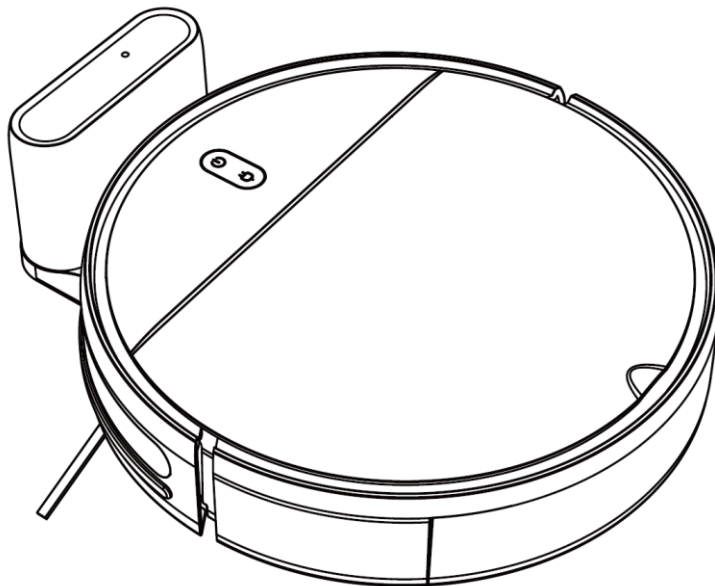




- Check that the product is intact and undamaged and all parts are present.
- Dispose of packaging materials responsibly.
- No tools are required, but some assembly of your Vacuum is required.

Safety Advice

- **IMPORTANT** – The first step you need to take is to ensure your safety! Please take time to read and understand these instructions before using the product.
- Please keep these instructions for future reference.
- Check that the voltage indicated on the data plate corresponds with that of the local network before connecting the appliance to the mains power supply.
- This appliance can be used by persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- Children shall not play with the appliance.
- Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children less than 8 years when it is energised or cooling down.
- **DO NOT** immerse the appliance or its cord in water or any other liquids.
- **DO NOT** leave the appliance unattended during use.
- **DO NOT** leave the appliance unattended whilst connected to the mains supply.
- **DO NOT** use this appliance outdoors.
- It is imperative to unplug the power cord after the appliance has been used, before it is cleaned and whilst being repaired.
- Repairs to electrical appliances should only be performed qualified personnel. Improper repairs may place user at serious risk.
- **DO NOT** operate this appliance with a damaged plug or cord, after a malfunction or after being dropped or damaged in any way.
- Regular, periodic checks should be carried out on the mains cable to

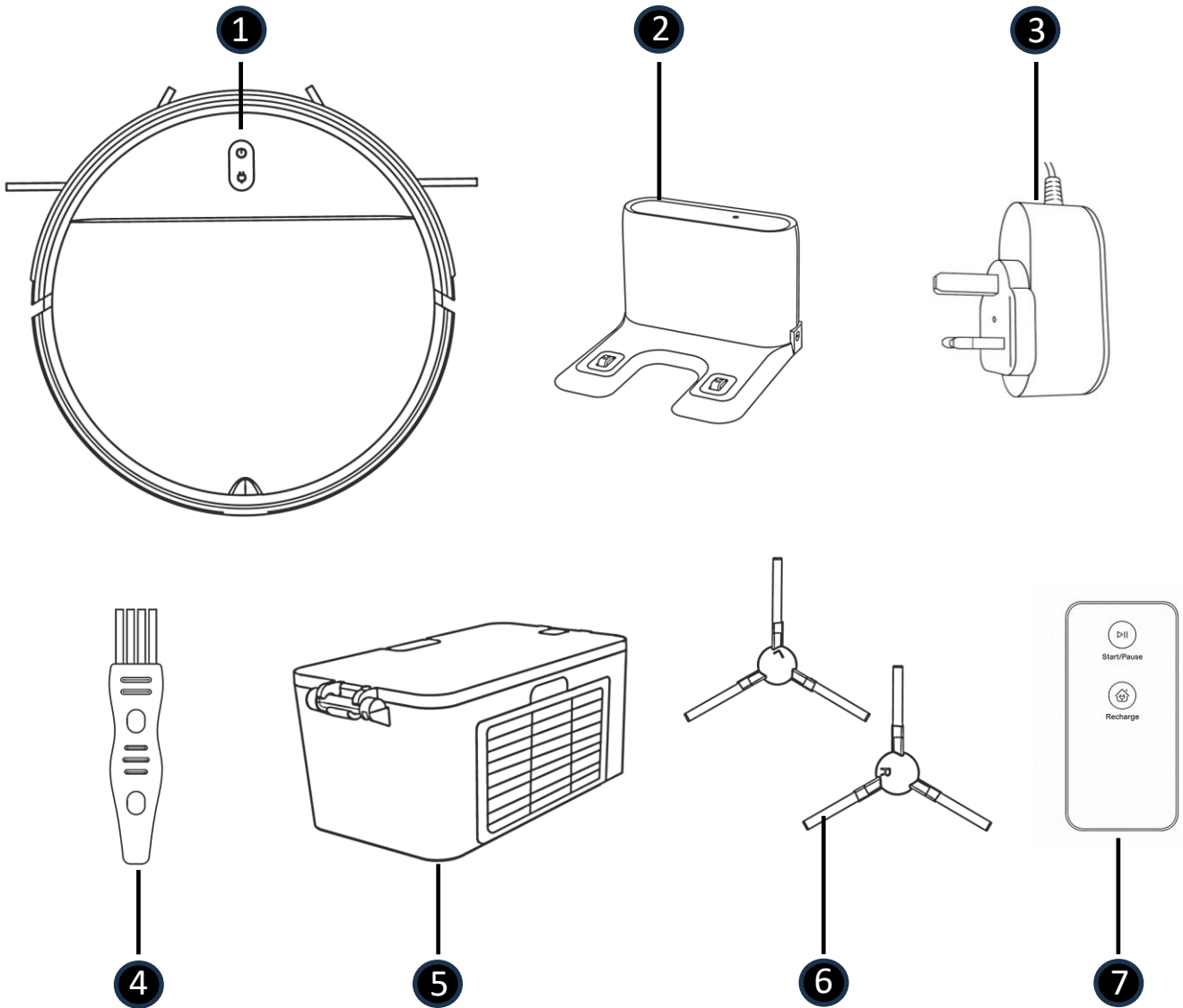
- ensure no damage is evident. Should there be any signs of damage the appliance should not be used.
- If the power cable is damaged, it should only be replaced by the manufacturer or a suitable qualified after-sales-service in order to avoid a hazard.
- **DO NOT** allow the mains cable to hang over sharp edges or come in contact with hot surfaces.
- Allow the unit to cool before storage.
- Before cleaning, disconnect the appliance from the mains supply and allow to cool.
- This appliance is intended for household use only and should not be used for industrial purposes.
- **DO NOT** use any accessories or attachments with this appliance other than those supplied or recommended by supplier.
- **DO NOT** use this appliance for anything other than its intended use.
- **DO NOT** push objects into any openings as damage to the appliance and/or electric shock may occur.
- Unplug after each use. Grasp the plug, not the cord.
- **DO NOT** pull or carry the Charger by the electrical cord.
- Ensure fingers and other objects are never placed in any part of the vacuum cleaner. Clothing or hair may become trapped if the vacuum is used improperly.
- Keep hair, loose clothing, jewellery, fingers and all parts of the body away from openings and moving parts.
- Keep all air vents clear and free of dust, lint, hair and anything else that may reduce airflow.
- Avoid directing the appliance towards naked flames as the air discharged may extinguish gas fires or pilot lights and may disturb ashes in open fires.
- **DO NOT** Vacuum water or any other liquids with this vacuum.
- **DO NOT** Vacuum hot ashes or lit cigarettes, etc.
- Never use the appliance without the filter in place.
- **DO NOT** use the Vacuum without the Dust Compartment fitted.
- **DO NOT** vacuum any large or broken objects such as glass.
- **DO NOT** vacuum anything that is burning or smoking such as cigarettes, matches or hot ashes.

Remove the Protective Covering

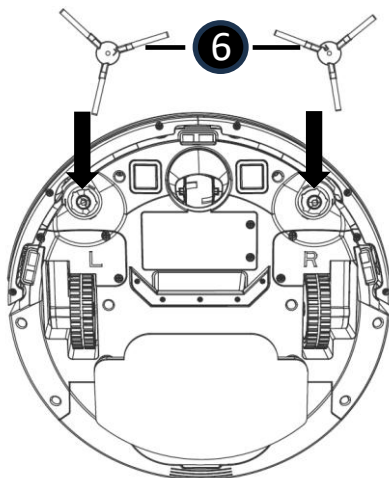
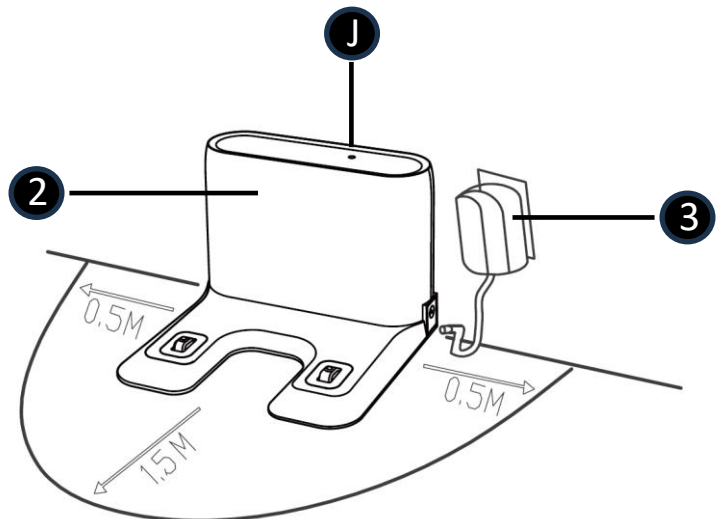


Before use, remove the protective strips from the **Robot Vacuum** (1) and the film from the **Charging Station** (2).

Charging the Battery

Step 1

Place the **Charging Station** (2) on flat ground against the wall. Do not place any articles 0.5m to the left or right of the charging station or 1.5m in front. Insert the **Charger** (3) into the nearest mains socket. The **Power Indicator** (J) will illuminate. **NB** the **Charging Station** (2) must be powered continuously during use.



Step 2

Push the two **Side Brushes** (6) onto the spindles on the underside of the Robot Vacuum.

Step 3

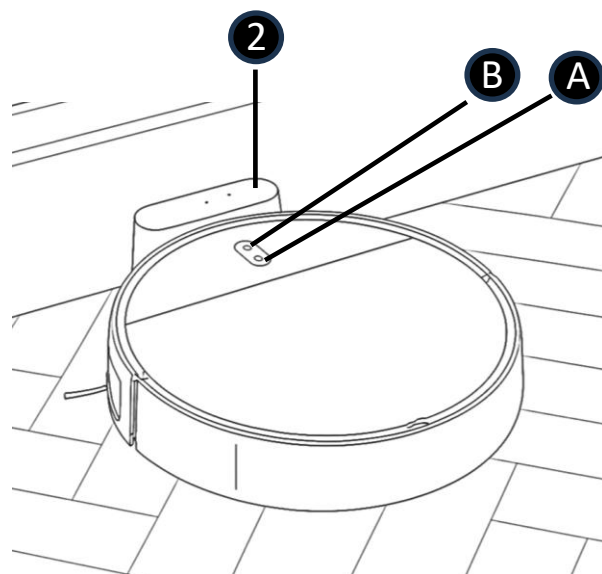
Place the **Robot Vacuum (1)** onto the **Charging Station (2)** as shown.

The **Power Button (B)** will illuminate and the **Charge Indicator (A)** will slowly flash to show the vacuum is charging. Once the indicator stops flashing the battery is fully charged and the vacuum is ready to use.

NB Do not use the **Charging Station (2)** in direct sunlight or near mirrors which could cause reflections.

It is recommended to fully charge the vacuum before each use to maximise the life of the unit.

The charging time is approximately five hours.

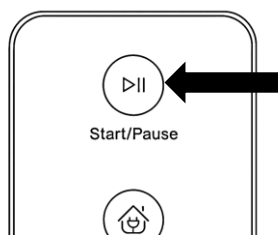
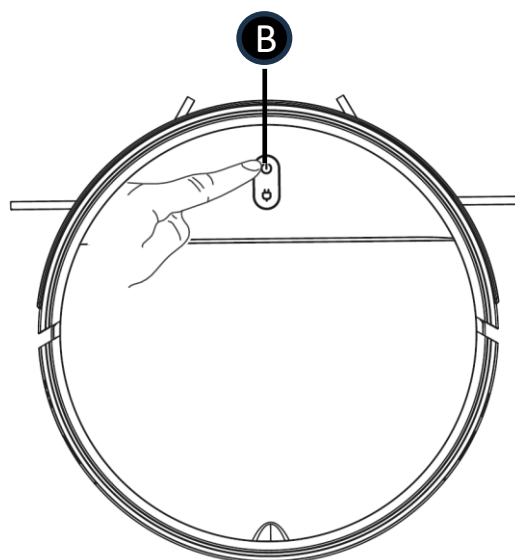


IMPORTANT Only use the Charger supplied with the product, using any other charger may result in permanent damage to the cleaner and could invalidate your warranty.

Cleaning

1. Press the **Power Button (B)** briefly to start vacuuming. The vacuum will chime and start vacuuming. Press the **Power Button (B)** to pause vacuuming

NB If the unit is in the off state (i.e. no indicators lit) press the **Power Button (B)** for 2-3 seconds to power up the vacuum.

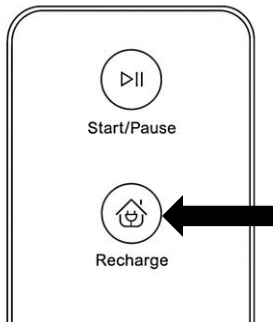
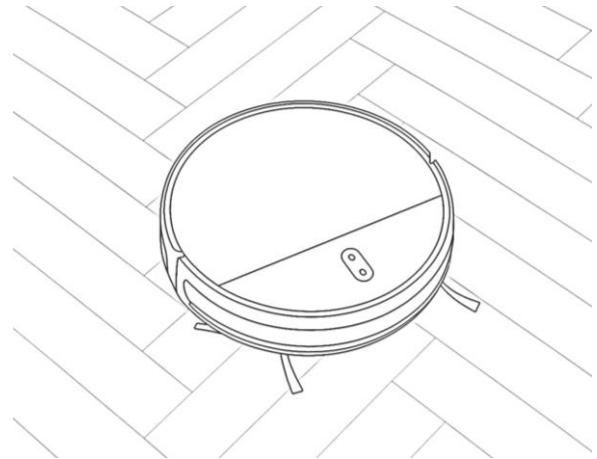


2. Alternatively press the Start/Pause Button on the **Remote Control (7)** to start vacuuming. Press the Start/Pause Button again to pause vacuuming.

3. The vacuum will randomly clean the floor for up to 90 minutes, after which it will automatically return to the **Charging Station (2)** to recharge the battery.

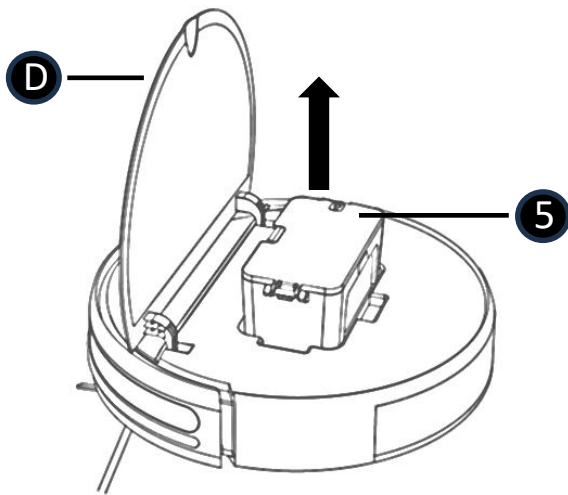
NB During cleaning, the vacuum will monitor its own power level.

If the power is insufficient, it will activate the returning mode and automatically return to the **Charging Station (2)** for recharging.



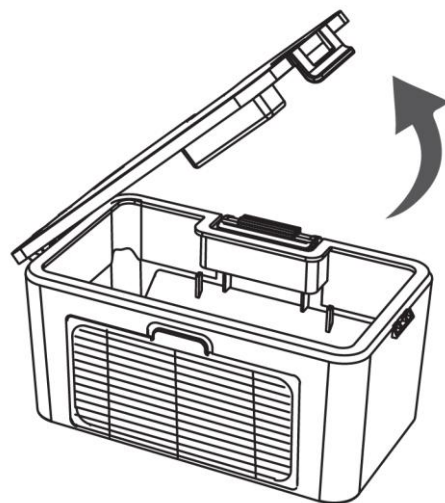
4. Alternatively, press the recharge button on the **Remote Control (7)**. This will stop the **Robot Vacuum (1)** vacuuming and return it to the **Charging Station (2)** for recharging.

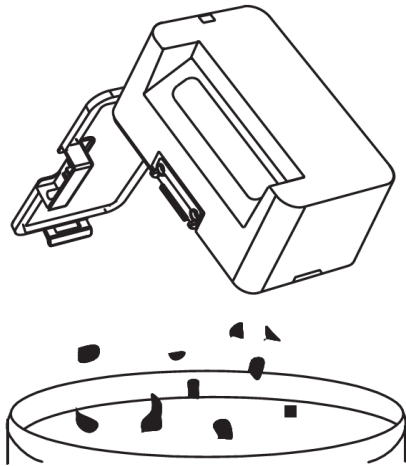
Emptying the Dust Compartment



1. Remove the **Dust Compartment (5)** from the **Robot Vacuum (1)** by lifting the **Lid (D)** and pulling the Dust Compartment upwards.

2. Open the catch on the **Dust Compartment (5)** and lift the lid.....



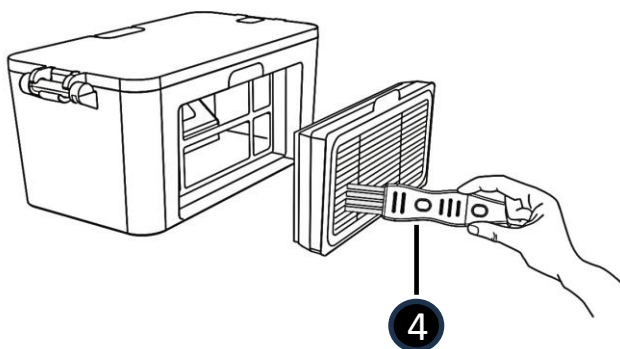
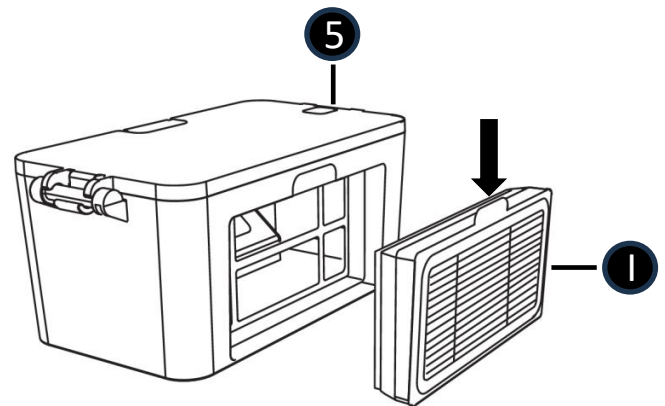


3.and empty out the contents over a Dust Bin.

Cleaning the Hepa Filter

It is recommended that the **Hepa Filter (I)** is cleaned every 15-30 days.

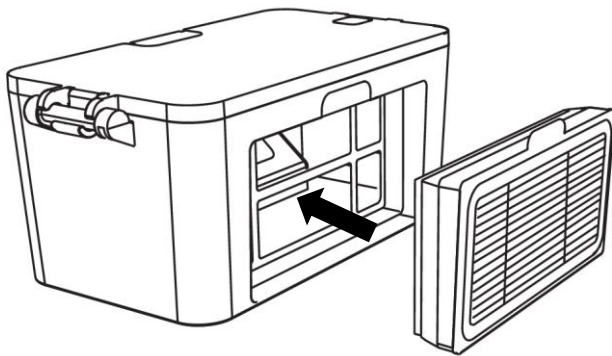
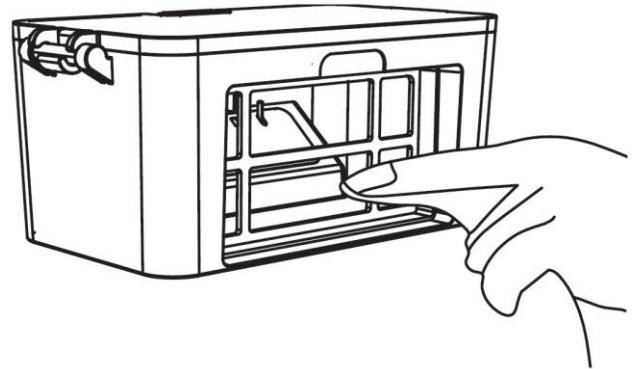
1. Remove the **Hepa Filter (I)** by pulling it out of side of the **Dust Compartment (5)** using the tab arrowed right.



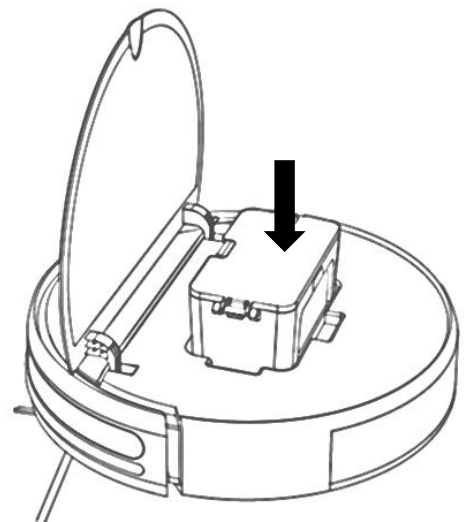
2. Shake the excess dirt from the **Hepa Filter (I)**. Brush the filter clean using the **Cleaning Brush (4)**.

NB Do not expose the Hepa Filter to sunlight. Do not wash the Hepa Filter.

3. Clean the **Dust Compartment (5)** out using a cloth or brush.

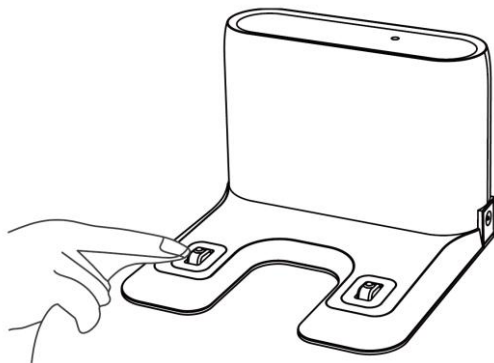


4. Push the **Hepa Filter (I)** into the side opening of the **Dust Compartment (5)**.



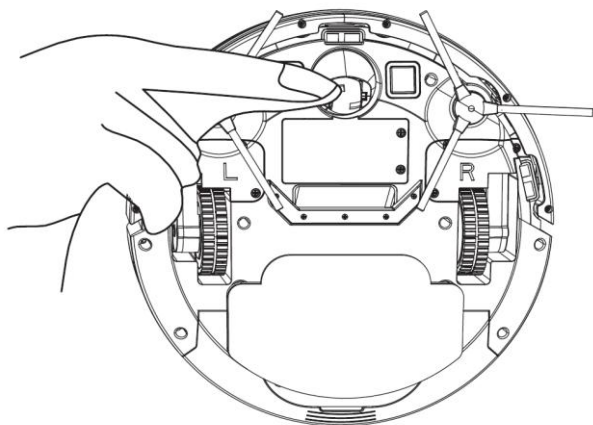
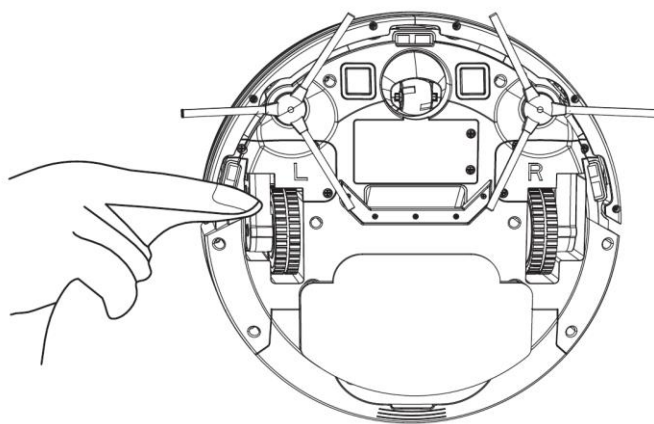
5. Replace the **Dust Compartment (5)** into the **Robot Vacuum (1)** and close the **Lid (D)**.

WARNING! Always remove the **Charger** (3) from the mains socket before cleaning.



Periodically wipe the contacts clean on the **Charging Station** (2) with a clean damp cloth.

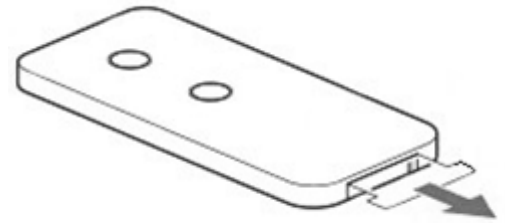
Periodically wipe the lower visual sensors on the underside clean using a clean damp cloth.



Keep the **Driving Wheels** (H) and **Universal Wheel** (F) free of dust and hairs etc.

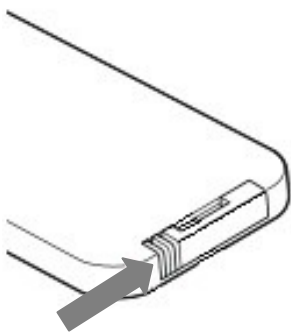
- Always disconnect the cleaner from the mains charger before cleaning.
- Clean the outside of the cleaner with a clean damp cloth. Never clean with harsh or abrasive cleaners.
- Do not submerge the cleaner or its charger in water or any other liquids.
- Wash the Hepa Filter every 15-30 days of use.
- Allow the Hepa Filter to thoroughly dry out for 24 hours before reassembly and reuse.

If you are using the **Remote Control (7)** for the first time, pull the tab from the battery compartment as shown right to enable the supplied battery inside.

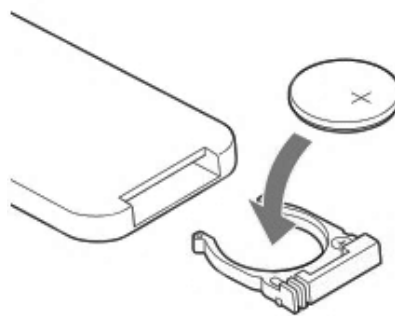


Replacing the Battery in the Remote Control

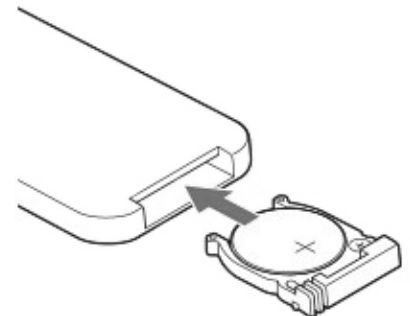
If the Remote-Control range has become reduced or it has stopped working altogether the battery will need replacing as shown below:



A Turn the remote upside down and push the tab on the battery compartment in the direction of the arrow as shown above.



B Slide the battery compartment out and insert a new CR2025 battery ensuring the positive polarity marking is uppermost.



C Slide the battery compartment back into the Remote Control.

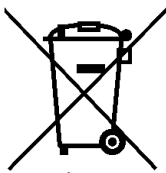

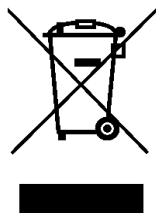
